MEET REPORT: BERG HIKE DIDIMA 16 TO 22 DECEMBER 2011

This hike turned out to be the most strenuous of all the December Berg hikes that I have organised and led. It has set a new standard which will be hard to follow in future, both in terms of the hard grade of the hike, the beauty of the area and the number of people who successfully completed it.

The party consisted of Andre Dalais, Franscois Gouws, Irene Kalimeri, Erica Davies, Philip Welchman, Lynn Morris, Kim Hoepfl, Dave Taylor, Greg and Cheryl Devine, all from the Jhb section, with Dave Collett from SC section and Andriana Stoddart, Anna Dimou and Paul Stoddart from Australia (previously Jhb section).

We started from the Visitor Centre at Didima (Cathedral) and went straight up Tryme hill and along the ridge to the Contour Path. This was followed in a southerly direction to the campsite below Philip's Folly on the upper Ndedema river, where we camped. The next day we continued up the valley and up the remote Tlanyaku Pass. Although we were then on the escarpment there was still a long uphill slog to our camp spot above the Ndedema Falls. This was the hardest day of the hike and our difficulties were compounded by thick mist, but we managed to stay together and find a suitable camp with water.

The next morning dawned bright and clear and we were able to find the long ridge path leading to the top of Grey's Pass. This path is at about 3 300 metres and gives great views over KZN and Lesotho. There were many shepherds about grazing great flocks of sheep. After peering over the edge at Vulture's Retreat we had lunch at the river on the top of the pass and then went down. Since there was no water at Keith Bush camp we decided to go a few hundred metres down the valley to camp.

This was definitely the "Blister Hike" as almost everyone suffered a bit and some suffered a lot, particularly Dave Collett. The Stoddart family had misread the instructions and thought it was a four day hike and not a four night hike, so they were out of food. As a result, the next day the Stoddarts and Dave decided to take the short-cut to

Monk's Cowl and find their way back to Didima by taxi. The rest of the party continued along the Contour path around the Gatberg and along Eastman's ridge back to the first night's camp spot on the Ndedema.

On the final day we descended Mike's Pass back to the cars parked at Didima. The route turned out to be 89 km long. After a shower at the campsite we met up at Bingelela (a great pizza joint near Bergville) for lunch, before the drive home. So ended a great hike through one of the most remote, beautiful and pristine parts of the Berg. Only one question remains, where to next year?
